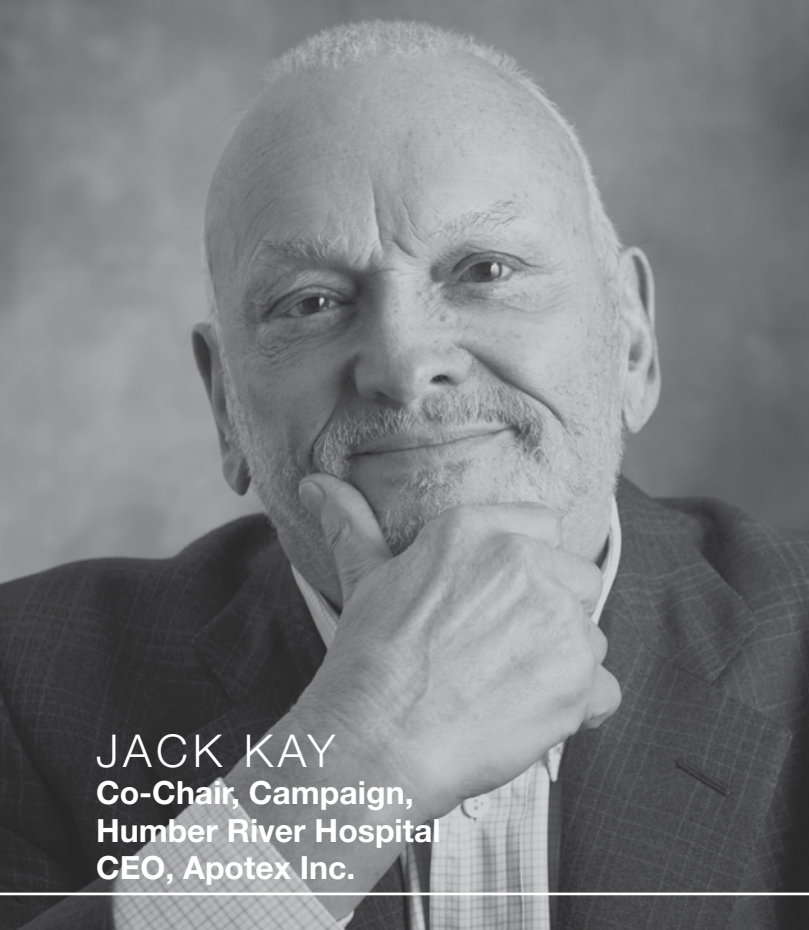

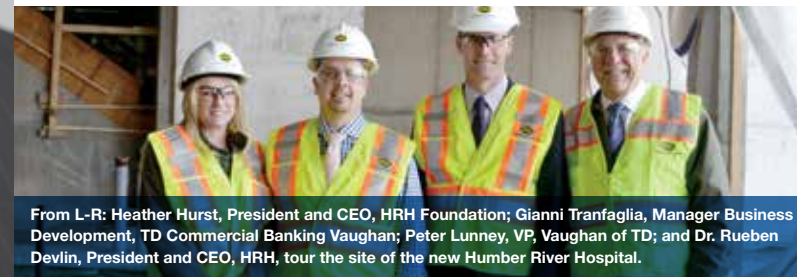

In total the green initiatives will offset 20,000 tonnes of CO2, which is equivalent to taking 4,000 cars off the road, saving 7,000 acres of forest. Thanks to a very generous donation from supporter and former Humber patient Jane Wilson, Humber's doctors and nurses now have a brand new, battery-operated K-wire driver and a brand new bladder scanner to assist them in caring for patients' complex needs.

"It was fun to be able to donate for a specific need – something tangible that I can have a photograph of," explains Jane. "I had hardware removal surgery by Dr. Patrick Tansey and I was treated well at Humber. I think it is important to remind donors that hospitals like Humber, which are not located in the high rent districts, also need their support, perhaps even more so."

Both pieces of equipment have been purchased and installed at Humber's Finch site. The new K-wire driver is already being used by the Orthopedics Department, helping doctors to set bones quickly and efficiently to begin the healing process. This busy department has a few K-wire drivers, but needs more.

"On busy days, which is almost every day, we have to work extra hard to keep up with our patient load," explains Dr. Tansey. "The other day in fact, one of our K-wire drivers broke down, and we were fortunate enough to have a brand new one that we could use – thanks to Ms. Wilson's generous donation."

As many at Humber would agree, our community's needs are great. However, if we work together as a community we can make sure everyone is taken care of. Optimizing our doctors' talents with the equipment they need is an important way to help our community heal.

"We do our best to care for patients within our publicly funded system, but donations like Ms. Wilson's are very welcome to help us enhance the care we deliver," states Dr. Tansey. "We're all in this together, and support from the community definitely goes a long way."

Most Torontonians will now have seen our playful sign just off Highway 401, on the site of the new Humber River Hospital. It's hard to miss the impressive structure that will one day be our new home.

We are making excellent progress in the construction of our new hospital – which is on time and on budget. Speaking of numbers, by now one very important number probably sticks in your mind – \$225 million. That's the amount we have to raise to build and equip our new hospital. And what an impressive number it is! But if you dig a little deeper, you'll find that the new Humber River Hospital is full of interesting facts and figures.

Here's the new Humber River Hospital, by the numbers:

- 225,000,000 - dollars to be raised to build and equip the new hospital
- 114,000 - ER visits in the first year
- 51,489 - pieces of equipment to be purchased
- 42,000 - surgeries performed annually
- 20,000 - equivalent savings in tons of CO2 due to green initiatives

ASK Barb

Your questions about the new Humber River Hospital project answered by Barb Collins, COO, Humber River Hospital.

Q What will happen to the current three Humber River Hospital sites when the new hospital opens?

A Humber River has worked with the local community and elected representatives for more than a decade to develop a model for the future of our hospital – one that provides the hospital facility our community needs and deserves. Both the Church and Keele sites are, by all accounts, past their useful life as acute care hospital facilities.

With the building of the new hospital, located at Keele Street and Highway 401, both the Church and Keele sites of Humber River Hospital will be decommissioned. The Finch site will subsequently be redeveloped as an ambulatory care facility and urgent care centre. Future use of the Church and Keele sites will be guided by applicable City of Toronto by-laws, and determined in consultation with the surrounding communities.

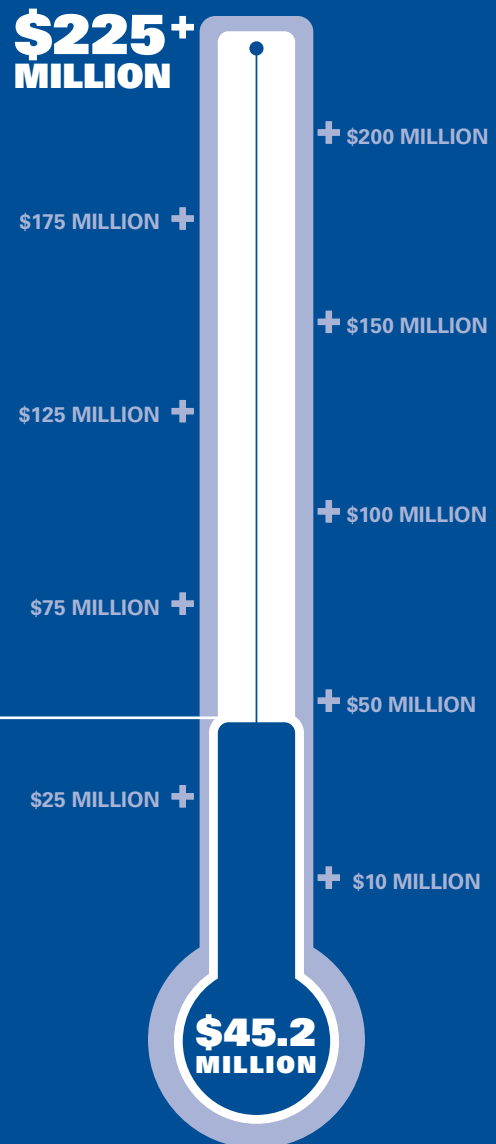
