Thanks to the generosity of Leon's, the families of our patients now have beautiful, soothing places to wait for news, enjoy some quiet time or reflect on this life-changing event," explains Ms. Philp. "Before this transformation, our waiting rooms were showing the wear and tear of constant use. Our beautiful new rooms help put our patients and their families at ease and are one more aspect of the family-centered approach we strive for at HRRH."

As with any expanding family, Mr. Leon is greatly anticipating the opening of the new Humber River Regional Hospital, and the impact it will have for all of us.

"I am extremely excited about the new hospital, especially the fact that it is a significant development in our area that will help the entire community,"



explains Mr. Leon. "I don't think I've ever been as excited as I am for this new hospital, especially in terms of the betterment of the community."

Over the past few months, Mr. Leon has had several meetings with senior staff at the hospital to talk about the plans for the new hospital and the intricacies involved with a project of this magnitude.

"I've visited many hospitals across the country and I am so impressed with the work HRRH executives have done – the planning that is involved for this new hospital is tremendous and I feel that they have covered all the bases. They've done the research and they're doing it right."

COMMUNITY AND THIRD PARTY EVENTS

You could say it takes a village to build a hospital. HRRH Foundation is fortunate to have many partners in our “village” who take up our cause and raise funds for the hospital. Here are highlights of the past year’s community and third party events, which raised **\$52,961.24**.

McHappy Day 2010 – Three McDonald’s locations (Kipling, Albion and Finch & Weston) supported HRRH in the nation-wide McHappy Day. On May 5, 2010, \$1 from the sale of every Big Mac, McMuffin Sandwich and Happy Meal sold at these locations was donated to the HRRH Paediatrics Department. DONOR STORY

The year was 1946. World War II had just ended, and the men and women of the Rotary Club of Weston were in the midst of rebuilding their lives. One important aspect of that rebuilding was healthcare, or rather the absence of a hospital in Weston. This community needed a hospital – and the Rotary Club took this to heart, fundraising and working hard to make sure a hospital was built. In 1948, the doors of the current HRRH Church Street site opened – it was the start of a beautiful friendship!

“The Rotary Club celebrates our long-term relationship with Humber River – we take our commitment to our hospital very seriously and in many ways, we feel we have helped give birth to the hospital,” states Syd Wilson, chairman, Rotary Club Toronto Humber.

For over 60 years, the Rotary Club and their dedicated volunteers have been supporting HRRH. After the voluntary merger of the Rotary Clubs of Weston and Downsview, respectively, into the current Rotary Club Toronto Humber, members from across the community brought together their unique perspectives and fundraising ideas, both of which have benefitted HRRH through the Rotary TV Auction, The Sports Celebrity Dinner and other funding.

Most recently, a generous donation was made to the hospital in memory of four deceased Rotarians who received cancer treatment at HRRH. The \$5,000 donation, made in memory of Maurice Hampton, Leonard Hunt, Don Thomson and Dr. Joe Ferrari, will be directed towards the Oncology Department – Chemotherapy Clinic to purchase much needed equipment.

“We are most thankful that this gift was specifically directed toward equipment for the clinic. This allowed staff to discuss our needs and purchase the items most urgently needed,” states Camille Robinson, Manager, Inpatient Oncology, Chemotherapy Clinic & Chaplaincy. “This new equipment will positively impact patient care in so many ways.”

The two treatment chairs will replace two chairs that are in need of repair; the supply cart will hold supplies (Intravenous equipment, supplies etc.) that the nurses use during the course of the day and will allow ease of transport of these items and therefore more efficient care; and the hazardous waste container holder allows staff to dispose of hazardous waste in a sealed container using a foot pedal, which lessens the possibility of exposure to staff and patients.

Dear HRRH Foundation Board of Directors, Foundation Staff and the Al Palladini Education Endowment Fund Selection Committee,

My name is Patricia Rakopoulos and I am writing to you today because this time two years ago I was fortunate to receive a scholarship from the Al Palladini Education Endowment Fund. On behalf of myself and the more than a dozen other recipients, I would like to express a heart-felt ‘thank you’ for investing in our studies and training. Through the Foundation’s dedication to healthcare and the generous support of the Palladini family, I have been able to pursue a Masters of Science degree at the University of Ottawa in the department of Cellular and Molecular Medicine.

This past March I successfully defended my MSc thesis which I undertook in Dr. Jeffrey Dilworth’s laboratory at the Ottawa Hospital Research Institute. My thesis work focused on Mef2D; a gene involved in skeletal muscle development. The goal of my research has been to investigate the role of Mef2D in the formation of healthy muscle tissue so that we can better understand how genetic abnormalities contribute to the formation and progression of muscle disease. With new scientific insights come new opportunities for researchers to design better, more effective treatments for muscle diseases like Duchenne’s Muscular Dystrophy.

The Al Palladini Scholarship has been instrumental in relieving a significant part of that financial burden which I assumed when pursuing my Masters degree. With this scholarship I was able to devote more time to my research and to extracurricular activities in and around the Ottawa Hospital which enriched my experience and fueled my passion for healthcare research. I cannot thank the Foundation and Palladini family enough for supporting students in healthcare and can think of no better way to invest in the quality of our healthcare in the future.

“Jack was a real people person who loved getting together with friends and family to share stories,” says his wife Linda Tyrrell. “He loved politics and World War II aviation history, traveling, big band jazz and especially loved going to live theatre. Each summer, we always looked forward to the Stratford and Shaw Festivals, and we would always enjoy our trips to our favourite resort in New York State.”

Linda considers herself very lucky to have had the chance to share these wonderful memories with her husband during the last seven years of his life.

“He was able to live as normal a life as possible in our own home because of the dialysis team at Humber River Regional Hospital.”

Jack Tyrrell passed away in June 2003 from kidney disease. At the time, a generous donation was made to HRRH Foundation in his memory by Linda ensuring that he would continue to be remembered in a way that will benefit patients, their families, nurses and physicians.

“Jack had such a generous nature and he would be so pleased to know that we are giving back to a team that helped him so much. My hope is that this will benefit others who may be travelling the same path.”

The donation has been used to equip a brand new, innovative Nephrology Program Resource Centre, specifically designed to provide information for patients and their families about kidney disease and its treatment. The finishing touches on the new centre are being completed, and patients have already started using the computers now available to them. The new resource centre is primarily housed at the Keele Street site, however, a smaller centre has been set up at the Church Street site – ensuring all the patients who receive treatment have access to it.

“Thanks to the generous donation from Mrs. Tyrrell, our beautiful resource centre is ready to provide our patients with the information they require to help them transition through the stages of renal disease and help them make choices in renal replacement therapy,” explains Saverina Sanchez, Manager, Nephrology Program. “In our home training sessions, patients who must spend the day at the hospital learning how to do their treatment, can now access a computer and find the latest information on their care.”

Jack was first diagnosed with kidney disease in the early 1990s and became progressively weaker as his kidney function deteriorated. He soon required dialysis and was put on a waiting list for a kidney transplant. But instead of going to the hospital three times a week for dialysis, Jack took instruction from the dialysis team at HRRH and did peritoneal dialysis, which could be done from home.



“Home dialysis extended Jack’s life in a comfortable way and gave him the freedom to be at home and do what he enjoyed,” says Linda. “The staff at Humber was never more than a phone call away for instruction, guidance and reassurance, so we were never worried. They were a lifeline for Jack.”

Jobs will be created, economic opportunities will flourish and the best talent, innovation and investment will want to come to our community.

MESSAGE FROM JACK KAY

When your heart is telling you something is the right thing to do, you should do it. That's how I felt when I took on the role of Campaign Chair for the new Humber River Regional Hospital – it's the right thing to do, it's as simple as that. The hospitals in our catchment area are showing their age – we all deserve better, we need a new hospital.

The new HRRH will stand among Toronto's most important hospitals. The government has already come forward to support this vision. Now, the whole community has a chance to step up. It's easy to see that there is a shortfall from the funding that the government provides and it's up to the community to kick in the rest – it's up to all of us. I truly believe there is a responsibility among those who are able to give to support these types of projects.
