Our fundraising is needed to invest in the programs, technologies and equipment to continuously enable Humber to reinvent patient care in all of our programs of care such as Maternal Child, Cancer Care and Surgery, of which you'll read about in this Annual Report.

Maternal Child Program



There's a new addition to the Maternal Child Department! This year, we welcomed Lucina, a childbirth simulator that prepares staff for all stages of labour and delivery. As Lucina progresses through the stages of childbirth, her baby automatically descends through her birth canal, and even crowns and rotates. Staff can safely practice various labour and delivery maneuvers, depending on the unique situation before them, during a realistic and controllable birthing process. Lucina also simulates many delivery complications including shoulder dystocia, cardiac arrest, postpartum hemorrhaging, and the need for an emergency Cesarean section, which supports team training for obstetric emergencies, airway management, and mechanical ventilation. She automatically responds to clinical interventions when they are performed correctly, giving learners important realtime feedback – even providing advanced CPR metrics that measure the consistency of compressions and ventilations. Simulation training like this is essential for training staff so that they can practice deliveries in a safe environment.

High Touch: Baby Giancristian

No parent dreams of spending the first few weeks of their baby's life in a hospital. But for Baby Giancristian, Humber's Paediatric Inpatient Unit became home for three weeks as he battled a life threatening infection. As his doctors and nurses fought to save his life, Giancristian was able to heal his little body in a single patient room surrounded by soothing sunlight, except at nap time when his nurse would tint his dynamic glass window to dark. Mom and Dad never left his side, each would take turns spending the day with Giancristian, playing with his favourite toys, reading to him and making sure he knew he was never alone. During the day, Dad was able to work remotely right from the 4th floor in a special space our staff gave him. And at night, both Mom and Dad stayed over in the recliner chair that pulled out into a double bed, so if baby woke up in the middle of the night, they were always right there to rock him back to peaceful sleep.

Mom, Dad and baby are now at home and the future looks bright for the family. Thank you for bringing the comforts of home to Humber for our littlest patients and their parents.



Surgery Program



Traditionally, hip replacements are done by cutting through muscle from the side or back of a patient, resulting in months of recovery time and mobility precautions. That's why, when Dr. Sebastian Rodriguez performed the GTA's first anterior hip replacement it was a massive leap forward for Humber River Hospital. Using the Hana Table, funded by donor dollars, Dr. Rodriguez is able to perform hip replacement surgery through the front of a patient's hip between the muscles, which minimizes trauma, typically leads to less pain, and results in a faster recovery. His approach spares tissue and requires less surgical dissection, meaning less bleeding and less trauma for the patient. Anterior hip replacements do not require tendons and muscles to be cut, so patients are able to make quicker recoveries, and report experiencing less pain and more stability after surgery. Best of all, this minimally invasive procedure allows some patients to leave the Hospital within a day, compared to a typical hip replacement hospital stay of three to five days.

High Touch: Sandy

When Sandy learned she had breast cancer, she immediately thought she would receive treatment at a downtown cancer centre. But hearing her speak about Humber and the family-like environment she was able to heal in, you can tell Sandy is so glad she chose a different route. Today, Sandy has completed her breast reconstruction surgery with Humber plastic surgeon, Dr. Thomas Constantine (or Dr. C as he is affectionately known). For her post-surgery follow up appointment, Sandy visits the Plastic Surgery Clinic, which is conveniently located only 30 feet away from the Portal D entranceway on the south side of the Hospital. Sandy is warmly greeted by name by Nurse Joan, who tells everyone to call her Joanie, her nickname earned during her 41-year career at Humber.

Thank you for helping us create a familial, happy atmosphere at Humber for our surgery patients. Like any true family, success and triumphs are celebrated together, giving hope to all patients that there is so much life to live after cancer.



Cancer Care Program



Humber River Hospital was the first hospital in the province to integrate the MediTech Oncology Solution, which is used in our Cancer Care Program to order, book, schedule and track each patient's treatments. This integrated system reduces the risk of error that comes with writing and rewriting information while transferring data between systems, and because all patient information is in one place, it provides a single view of a patient's progress. MediTech also connects seamlessly with the RIVA robot, which prepares chemotherapy drugs at Humber in a fully contained enclosure. RIVA prepares these drugs, and performs multiple weight checks and barcode scans throughout to ensure doses are accurate and complete for every individual patient. The entire system is designed to mitigate the potential for human error, to increase efficiency in our Cancer Care Program, and most importantly to keep patients and staff safer.






Historical Trend
