Innovations that you help make possible!

You recently received a letter sharing stories of how we are bringing Humber into your homes with our innovative home dialysis program.

As you'll recall, home dialysis was pioneered and perfected here at Humber by Dr. Pierratos and he has been working on this for decades. Most recently, he shared an urgent need to buy new NxStage machines, which are small and portable dialysis units that can be used in compact homes, condos, and apartments and even in retirement homes. I'm thrilled to share that many of our donors have responded, but there is still time for you to give and help us purchase more life-saving equipment.

For another perspective on this story, we also want you to meet David. David shares how Humber changed his life—and how he has made a promise to give back, forever.



"Nearly 40 years ago, I was diagnosed with kidney disease. My life changed overnight. For the rest of my life, I was going to need dialysis 3 times a week for 4 hours at a time. Little did I know that



Dr. Pierratos was going to pioneer a dialysis solution that would change my life once again. Because of Humber River Hospital, I can do my own dialysis, at home, while I'm sleeping. It's this kind of passion and innovation that makes me a proud supporter of the Foundation. I see for myself, every single day, how dedicated the Humber team is to my health care. I can't imagine my life without our Hospital.

I'm living proof that anything can happen, at any moment. You just don't know when you will need the hospital. That's also why I've decided to leave Humber in my Will. I know the money will be used well, just as it is today. I believe that all of us have a responsibility to support our Hospital today and into the future. It feels really good to know that the Hospital will continue to be there for my loved ones and for other people like me, forever."
