



## **Donors Put Their Support to the Test**

Thanks to an outpouring of love and support from the community, we are proud to claim that every COVID-19 test done at Humber River Hospital is thanks to the generosity of our donors.



Starting from the beginning of the pandemic right up until the end of December, donors far and wide came together to raise over \$500,000 for all the testing equipment needed at Humber. This includes support from community leaders like Upper Crust, IC Savings and The Rogers-Hixon Foundation who led the way with leadership gifts. Today, the lab has the ability to successfully complete up to 1,400 tests a day for patients in Surgery, the Emergency Department, clinics and transfers to long-term care, with most results coming back within an hour.

After almost a decade of fundraising, the HRH Family Practice Physician team has proudly exceeded their fundraising goal and raised \$281,327 which is well over their original target of \$250,000! In total, 86 family physicians gave personal gifts and multi-year pledges and most recently, we had powerful matching gift initiatives led by Dr. Seong Choe and Dr. Bharat and Dr. Sheila Shah.

## WINK: Women Join Forces to Donate \$50,000 to Humber's NICU

On International Women's Day, 25 women opened their laptops and logged into their Zoom accounts ready to hear directly from Humber's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) and Emergency Department (ED) Patient Comfort Fund.

Every year, Women in Kindness (WINK) works together to support Humber River Hospital. Members join WINK through an entry donation and have the opportunity decide together where their funds will be directed, making meaningful change throughout our Hospital community.

This year, after hearing from program directors, physicians, staff, and grateful patients from both Programs, the women voted to direct their collective \$50,000 gift to the NICU, which plans to use the donation towards purchasing a new ventilator to support the care of our tiniest patients.

"I am so grateful that these powerful women are choosing to empower others," says Jhanvi Solanki, Program Director of the Maternal & Child Program. "The NICU being this year's WINK recipient was the most meaningful compliment. Even if we hadn't won, the understanding and interest from the WINK group will be something I will carry forever."

"One of our big promises to our WINK members is that they will always be in control of their collective funds," says Lindsay Owen, a Development Officer at Humber River Hospital Foundation. "They have the power to direct their money, and they get insider access to the world of Humber to help them make informed decisions."

### **Care That Won't Quit**

Throughout the pandemic, Programs across our Hospital have adapted to provide the best patient-centered care given our new reality. Here's what our patients, physicians, and staff have to say:

"Our entire team has done a great job of continuing to provide care, and most of our patients haven't had a delay in care. When it comes to cancer, even a few weeks can make a difference in outcomes, so everyone came together to make sure that urgent treatments, procedures, and medical imaging was getting done. Virtual care has meant that we are able to see many of our patients regularly without exposing them to additional risk. And patients coming in for chemotherapy are being tested before every cycle."

"In the final weeks of my pregnancy I thought I felt my water break, but I quickly realized it was blood. The ambulance took me straight to Humber. The team made sure I was okay and reassured us that our daughter was fine. It was a relief during COVID that my husband was able to stay with me the whole time. After Zoey was born, David stayed with us in our room. If we needed food or anything from downstairs, a Patient Family Liaison got it for us so that he didn't need to leave the room."

"In our Pharmacy Department, I lead a team of people responsible for preparing and delivering COVID-19 vaccine syringes to the nurses who administer it to the patients. We thaw the vaccine vials from an ultra-low temperature to room temperature, disinfect them, and prepare and barcode each syringe in a completely sterile environment, exceeding all the mandatory standards. Every syringe we deliver is thoroughly checked and ready to be administered. During these times when people are struggling with the pandemic, I feel very proud of our Pharmacy Department, which is currently working hard to prepare over 100 doses an hour."

"A few months after my dad started dialysis, COVID-19 arrived and Toronto went into lockdown. We started to be concerned that he would be exposed to the virus during his frequent trips out of the retirement home. He needed this life-saving treatment, but that fear was always in the back of our minds. We were so grateful when he was given the opportunity to start using NxStage, a dialysis machine he could use in his retirement home with the help of a personal support worker."

"A few months ago, before schools were planning to reopen after months of being closed during the pandemic, clinicians on our team noticed that many of our young patients were experiencing anxiety, trouble thinking, and difficulties sleeping in anticipation of going back to school. So Flora, who is a Child and Youth Worker, and I teamed up to develop a one-day workshop for 13 to 17 year old outpatients with back to school fears. I'm really proud we were able to make that transition easier."

"My Carpal Tunnel Syndrome had gotten so bad that I was at risk of losing full functionality of my hands. After the first wave of COVID-19 I learned I was going to be one of the first patients scheduled for surgery. I was grateful but also nervous. My surgeon Dr. Ayeni was amazing. He created a light, comfortable atmosphere. Even though we were all wearing masks that really put me at ease. After my surgery, I felt immediate relief. I am so happy I can use my hands again!"

## The Humber Frontline Education Support Fund

We started the Humber Frontline Support Fund as a way to put a smile on the faces of our frontline, in recognition of the tremendous personal sacrifices they have made for all of us during the pandemic. We have seen a surge of patients in mental health crisis because of the loneliness of social distancing, job losses due to a beleaguered economy and general feelings of despair that this pandemic has intensified. Many of these patients struggle with the basic human needs. Through the generosity of our donors, we have created an official Patient Comfort Fund at Humber that provides those patients who are most in need with vouchers for transportation and/or food.

And, I enjoy telling others about Humber's Automated Guided Vehicles (AGVs) that deliver linens, food and non-narcotic medication throughout the Hospital.

#### Do you have a favourite fundraising project?

I have been on Team Revolution for about five years. We are a group of cyclists who raise money for local healthcare and have raised over \$2 million to date! I have travelled with Team Revolution to Italy twice to ride in granfondos in support of Humber River Hospital.
