The COVID-19 pandemic challenged Cancer Care in different ways compared to other parts of the Hospital.

Together with the confidence of our Hospital and the support of donors like you, we were able to keep up with surgeries and treatments. There were two big impacts, however. One is that we are now seeing patients with much more advanced cancers, that would likely have been detected earlier. As you know, patients either couldn't see their doctors, had their check-ups or screenings cancelled, or thought it was probably nothing and would get it checked out later. So, today, we are seeing this ripple across the healthcare system, and in Cancer Care it means more challenging and advanced cancers that patients are not prepared for.

The second major impact has been that, for much of the COVID-19 pandemic, family members and loved ones weren't able to attend appointments or treatments to keep the risks of infection down. Diagnosis and early days of cancer treatment is emotional and scary, and it's much harder to do alone. And you also know what it's like: when you bring someone with you to an appointment, you have a second set of ears to hear different things and get a fuller picture. There was a study showing that a cancer patient remembers less than 20% of what the oncologist will tell them. Not having family members and loved ones with you is both an emotional and practical issue.



But here's the best part: a Peer Support program would help with both these problems!

That's why I'm so passionate about helping bring a Peer Support program to Humber. I'm proud to volunteer alongside Danielle on the Patient Family Advisory Council to move this critical project forward. I have so much respect for Danielle and I love what she's doing. She wants to help and support others, even with so much going on with her and her 3 beautiful kids. She is so dedicated to making an impact with Peer Support—and she knows it will help improve the experiences of other patients like her. It's part of her life story."

From my very first appointment until my most recent appointment, Dr. Rana always gives me all the time I need. You know what it can be like with family doctors, specialists, surgeons—sometimes you can feel rushed. But I've never felt that way with Dr. Rana.

I remember my first question to her was simple but serious: "Can I survive this?" She stopped typing and looked right into my eyes and said. "Yes. YES. You can survive this. Don't consider the statistics. Don't read too much online. I am an information seeker too and I will direct you to the sources and articles that you should read—and that will be best for both of us!"

I also knew it was a specialized, aggressive treatment but she said: "you're young and healthy. You can tolerate it."

I have learned to take this journey one moment at a time. One needle at a time. One treatment at a time. You can never really be prepared for this, but I knew what to expect, even when my fingernail and toenail and all my hair fell out.





If my journey, my path, can provide support or hope or a spark of light to someone else just like me, I am proud to do that.

In so many of these moments, I just wanted to talk to someone. Anyone. I wanted to talk to someone who had Inflammatory Breast Cancer and survived more than 5 years. I was seeking a real voice, from a real person, who could reassure me in such a dark and scary time. Your perspective changes when you have cancer, and I would have loved to talk to someone who had been through it. We need to get a Peer Support Program up and running at Humber. I'm committed to doing it. And if my journey, my path, can provide support or hope or a spark of light to someone else just like me, I am proud to do that. That's what I can give to the Hospital, and to other families, right now."
