### Toronto's First Fully Robotic Bladder Cancer Surgery: David's Story

David was devastated to receive the news that he had bladder cancer. Immediate action was needed, and he was quickly referred to Dr. Kevin Leung, a Urologist at Humber River Health



"Dr. Leung discussed the treatment plan, which involved the removal of the bladder, prostate, and lymph nodes," says David.

Dr. Leung offered robotic surgery as an option, emphasizing the quicker recovery rates. The da Vinci surgical robot was recently upgraded to the newest Xi model, thanks entirely to donor support. Without this upgrade, fully robotic bladder cancer surgery for David would not have been possible.

David chose the robotic surgery, which would be the first in Toronto—and yet another example of how Humber is lighting new ways in healthcare in our community. Dr. Leung notes that, "operating entirely with the da Vinci Xi allowed me to perform David's surgery in a much less invasive way compared to traditional bladder cancer surgeries. This meant less pain and a shorter recovery time."

David continues to undergo treatment, but recent tests show no cancer present. "I would rate my experience a 10 out of 10," says David. "The teamwork, expertise, and state-of-the-art technology made all the difference in my time at Humber!"

Hip Replacement – All in the Family

Shelley spent a decade in pain.

"My doctor believed the pain couldn't be serious due to my young age," Shelley recounts. Despite medication, the pain affected her daily activities and, "it affected my mental and emotional well-being."



Finally the pain became so intense, Shelley sought out emergency care. There, for the first time, a doctor suggested she needed a hip replacement – in fact, two.

Shelley describes her reaction to the news as both shock and relief. Someone had finally acknowledged how severe her condition was, and had offered a solution.

The prospect of surgery was daunting. Shelley was pleased to receive a suggestion from a neighbour who recommended Humber River Health's Dr. Sebastian Rodriguez-Elizalde. Soon after, Shelley read a newspaper article about the surgeon's success using the Hana Table. This surgical table, purchased thanks to donors like you, enables surgeons to position the patient so that smaller incisions can be made and no muscles are cut, resulting in shorter hospital stays and recovery time for patients.

Shelley travelled for hours to meet with Dr. Rodriguez-Elizalde, who confirmed that she was a good candidate for the innovative bilateral technique, which involves replacing both hip joints at the same time.

"The surgery under the skillful hands of Dr. Rodriguez-Elizalde was more successful than I had dared to hope," says Shelley. "I run a daycare, which is a physically demanding job, and being able to do this without pain is a joyous experience. Being able to engage fully with my grandchildren without pain has also brought me immense happiness."

Inspired by her positive experience, Shelley encouraged her mother to have her hip surgery at Humber River Health with Dr. Rodriguez-Elizalde.

"My mother's surgery was just as successful as mine," says Shelley. "I have so much faith in Dr. Rodriguez-Elizalde and the whole team at Humber River Health!"

# Urgent Care Clinic Filling the Gap for Child and Youth Mental Health Care

Anara\* was 17 the second time she came to Humber River Health's Jack & Pat Kay Emergency Psychiatric Unit. Several years earlier, she had attempted suicide. This time, although there were no safety concerns, she was overwhelmed by anxiety, mood swings and traits of personality disorder. Anara was referred to Humber River Health's Child & Adolescent Mental Health Urgent Care Clinic (UCC): an outpatient program for young patients who need support that can help prevent the need for inpatient care.



The UCC team provided Anara and her parents with the information and support they needed to understand and manage her mental illness. The team helped her to improve her ability to cope with stressful and emotional experiences. After a discussion about

medication options, Anara also agreed to try an antidepressant.

#### The ROSA Knee System

- Our second ROSA has been in use since last year, and we have now used it in more than 1000 surgeries. It has doubled our capacity to conduct knee



replacements. This means consequently less pain for our patients.

**da Vinci Xi Surgical Robot** – David's story (pg. 1) illustrates the value of the updated Xi version of our surgical robot. It provides greater precision, range of motion and 3D visualization for surgeons. This has expanded the range

of surgeries that can be performed, which means more patients can experience its reduced recovery time and minimal scarring. This technology is already in place, but we are still raising funds to cover the \$7 million cost.
